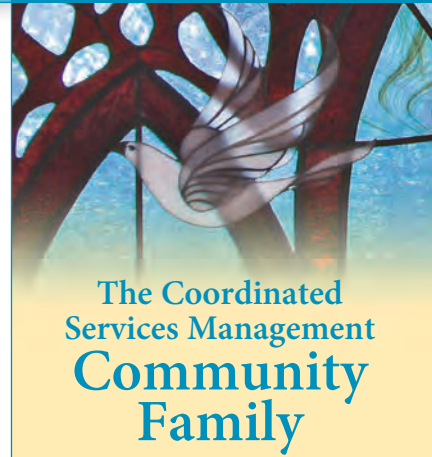


May Crowning
